As a Christian, your life has an eternal purpose. Jesus said, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me." That's in the gospel of Luke 9:23.



The cross was a symbol of death by execution. "Taking up your cross" means you are on your way to death, you are giving up your rights. Your life is not your own.

Doing God's will means that you are surrendering your passions, time, relationships - everything - to Him. When you do this, then you are ready to seek His will. You have to be willing to obey.

God has a great plan for you. He made you to serve Him. He made you so you could enjoy Him.

Take some time now and pray before you jump into these questions.

If you need help praying, say something like this:

God, thank you for saving me. Thank you, Jesus, for dying on the cross for my sin. Please forgive me. I want to serve you God, I will go anywhere and do anything that you ask. Please reveal your will to me even now as I work through these questions. In Jesus name, Amen.
