Hi there!

Before you get started, recognize that as a Christian, your life belongs to God. He has an eternal purpose for you!

Jesus said, “If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me.” That’s in the gospel of Luke 9:23.

The cross was a symbol of death by execution. “Taking up your cross” means you are on your way to death, you are giving up your rights. Your life is not your own.

Doing God’s will means that you are surrendering your passions, time, relationships - everything - to Him. Are you ready to do that? If you are, God is going to fulfill His dream for you. But you have to seek His will. You have to be willing to obey.

God has a great plan for you. You are unique! God has given you gifts, skills, and opportunities that are perfect for you. He made you to serve Him. He made you so you could enjoy Him.

Take some time now and pray before you jump into these questions. Then grab your favourite beverage, a pen, and write down the answers to these questions.

If you need help praying, say something like this:

God, thank you for saving me. Thank you, Jesus, for dying on the cross for my sin. Please forgive me. I want to serve you God, I will go anywhere and do anything that you ask.

Please reveal your will to me even now as I work through these questions. In Jesus name, Amen.

Awesome!

Also, let me say that God's will speak to you through the pages of Scripture. So working through these questions are a great way to supplement your time in His Word. These questions are meant to help you think about how God has wired you; but they are not a replacement for hearing His voice through the Bible. So make sure you are prayerfully reading His Word as often as you can!

Feel free to write the answers in the space provided or your journal.

Oh, and one more thing. With each question, write down the first answer(s) that come to mind. That's usually the best and most helpful response.

Here's the fifteen questions...

1. List as many of your skills and talents that you can (at least five). These can be anything that you are good at.

2. What do you enjoy doing? Write down the first things that come to mind.

3. Write down five (or more) things that you want to do before you die.

4. What gets you more excited: evangelism or discipleship? Circle one. Why?

5. Which are you better at: evangelism or discipleship? Circle one. Why?

6. What have you done that God has really blessed?

7. What unique opportunities do you have that others don't? This could have to do with relationships, location, skills, etc.

8. What makes you different from other people? Write down the first things that come to mind.

9. If money was no object, what would you do? Where would you go? What would you buy?

**10. If you could have any career,
what would it be? No limitations...**

11. If you received a salary increase, would you consider using it to help missionaries or sponsor a new evangelism program at your church?

12. How else could you spend your money that would contribute to God's plan for the world?

13. Have you considered starting a Bible study or prayer group in your school, workplace, or neighborhood? Why or why not?

14. Write down the name of one or two younger people you could mentor, either formally or informally. (If you are male, only mentor a male; if you are female, only mentor a female.)

15. What decision could you make right now that would advance God's Kingdom? If you had to make that decision this second, what would it be? What is your gut telling you?

Bonus Question: Describe the time in your life when you felt closest to God. Was it when you were serving? Praying? Worshipping? Does that tell you anything about His will for you?

A final word.....

Discovering and living God's will is a lifetime adventure.

These questions are meant to “prime the pump” and get you to think about some new opportunities. Talk to a trusted friend or family member and share your answers with them. And look for opportunities that God may bring your way.

You can't steer a vehicle that is not moving...so even if you still don't have a lot of clarity, serve — do something for God.

Ultimately, pray, trust the Lord, listen to His voice, and GO FOR IT!
